1. Overview

The mission of the Metropolitan Wind Symphony is to foster the musical education and enjoyment of the public by providing musical performing experiences for talented and interested members of the community, programs for the performance of traditional and contemporary wind music, and a channel for the commission and presentation of new musical works.

This FY 2020 Annual Report contains highlights of our artistic and organizational accomplishments, community involvement and feedback, and a financial overview for the 49th season of the Metropolitan Wind Symphony. While a normal season would start on September 1 and end on August 31, our FY 2020 "public" season basically ended in mid-March, coinciding with the statewide shutdown due to COVID-19. As a result, much of our organizational and educational endeavors were also canceled. We look forward to a time when we can once again gather safely and share our love of music with each other and with our audience members.

3. Organizational and Educational Highlights

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, MetWinds shut down operations in mid-March

2020 for the duration of the FY 2020 season. The Spring concert was canceled along with student outreach efforts which traditionally take place in the Spring. The Boston Festival of Bands, and five summer outdoor concerts were also canceled.

5. Financial overview

FY 2020 financials reflect the extraordinary impact of COVID-19. With seven concerts—a majority— of our concert season canceled, our income and expenses were not only remarkably well-balanced but showed a net gain at year's end. We believe this was due in large part to the generosity of our donors, grantors, and the small number of fixed costs.


As our most recent IRS Form 990 will show, MetWinds remains a solid, financially stable organization with a good balance between cash on hand to underwrite our everyday needs and investments to provide for future needs. We are blessed with a solid support system consisting of generous patrons and friends, audience members, performing members, small businesses, a host of volunteers as well as support from state and local grant programs.

For the past six years this report has focused on the substantial impact of donated in-kind services by a large network of community volunteers. We will continue to report on this as it illustrates the depth and breadth of volunteerism within the Metropolitan Wind Symphony and validates our worth to the community. Put simply, without these volunteer services, MetWinds would not be the organization you know today.

- Over 9,600 hours valued at over \$170,000 were donated in FY 2019*
 *FY 2020 figures are in process
- 124 volunteers including MetWinds board members, playing members and community members
- Total volunteer hours were the equivalent of 5.4 full-time employees
- Our cash expenses totaled \$41,831
