The performance will open with a symphonic fanfare by Venezuelan composer Giancarlo Castro D'Addona. Next, we will feature two works originally written for keyboard instruments: Prelude in the Dorian Mode, a fugal, organ work from the mid-1500's and Turina's Miniatures, a set of five, short pieces originally written for piano in 1930. The final piece of the first half will be James Barnes' exciting orchestration of Paganini's violin caprice featuring each section of the band. The second half will be comprised of two orchestral masterpieces: Shostakovich's Festive Overture, and Hindemith's large masterwork, Symphonic Metamorphosis, a quasi-symphony based on themes by Carl Maria von Weber. The March movement is oft-played but this is a rare opportunity to hear the entire work, so you won't want to miss it.
